



## Taking your pump on holiday: Pre holiday check list



Packing before you leave	
Before setting off on your holiday consider the following checklist and make sure you have visited the <b>MiniMed eShop</b> to order enough supplies:	
Extra pump batteries	
Insulin (and appropriate storage container)	
Pump supplies (reservoirs and sets)	
Insulin pen or syringes	
Ketone testing kit and strips	
Glucagon emergency kit (If you are already prescribed this by your GP)	
Bayer Contour Next Link glucose meter (Take a spare with you)	
Fast Acting Carbohydrate for treating hypos and extra food such as nutrition bars which are easy to carry	
Sharps disposal- BD safeclip from your GP on prescription	
And don't forget	
Key contact details of your doctor and diabetes healthcare team including the letter from them	
Wear or carry <b>medical ID</b> indicating that you have diabetes and that you are on an insulin pump	
Take your MiniMed pump getting started guide and a list of all your pump settings and the MiniMed 24hr helpline number which can be used anywhere in the world

**Top Tip:** Always carry medications, snacks, pump supplies and the letter from your doctor in your carry-on luggage when you fly. This is especially important because your luggage may be lost, or you may have unplanned delays for extended periods of time. Remember that Insulin in checked luggage may be exposed to extreme (often freezing) temperatures.
